Eleven classes from the elementary school came for **end of the year visits**. This is an opportunity for me to give them a tour of the library, encourage them to participate in summer activities at the library and tell stories. We also played a series of games together in order to emphasize the theme for summer reading, "On Your Mark, Get Set, Read!"

Go-Go Garden started up again in June. This group of elementary-aged students feel a real sense of ownership over the garden. Most of them are from last year's group, and are very eager to make sure the garden is a success again this year. We are growing radishes (which are

all ready for harvest!), tomatoes, peppers, beans, and pumpkins.

The Friends of the Library sponsored a float in the **Dairy Week** parade. Several teen volunteers helped put the float together, along with some of the Friends and staff. The float was accompanied by children on bikes who had decorated their bikes at the library previous to the parade. We won second place, and everyone who participated had a fun time.

On June 20, we held a **pizza party** to celebrate the kids who are participating in the "**1000 Books Before Kindergarten**" program. This program encourages parents or caregivers to read 1000 books to their child before



he/she begins kindergarten. We launched this program in the Fall 2015, and it has been well received. It is a great way to encourage parents to read to their kids.

Our **summer reading program** this year will be as it was last year: we will be counting minutes instead of books read. Kids and teens can enter into a raffle each week to win prizes and those who complete the summer program by checking in each week with their minutes read will be entered into a drawing for a mini iPad (there will be two separate drawings for teens and kids) or a Leapfrog pad for kids ages 0-4. This year we will continue the toddler, K-1, and 2-4th storytimes. We will have "Make it at the Library" which is a mash-up of Lego club and arts and crafts. We will also have a weekly teen activity, "Monday Mayhem" where we'll have video games out along with a different craft or activity planned each week.

We also have a variety of **special programs scheduled this summer** for the kids and teens, including Kids' Yoga, ZooMobile, SBU Artmobile Bollywood Dance Instruction, the Charlie Show (Magic), & Traveling Lantern.
