creative with strawberry-banana-chocolate chip pancakes. Janet also filled in for me with the artist club this month, helping the kids make polymer clay beads and figures.

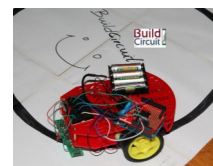
