We held 16 storytimes this month, finishing up our "school year".

For our final storytime of the year we had a special visit from Emma, a Great Pyrenees Mountain dog, and her owner Linda Senefelder. Linda taught the kids how to greet strange dogs and answered many questions about Emma and dogs in general. We also did a "stinky smelly storytime" this month where we talked about garbage trucks.

On May 4th we held a **Star Wars day** celebration and it was very well

attended, many patrons came in costume. There were three different activity stations: Jabba the Hut slime, pool noodle light sabers, and a paper plate BB8. We also had Chewbacca cupcakes. Brad and Kahlin Weaver came prepared to show us a light saber duel but unfortunately had some technical difficulties when one of the light sabers fell apart mid-duel. The kids had a blast despite the shortness of the duel. Brad will be coming back in July to teach a series of **swordplay classes** as part of the **teen summer programming**.



Due to a grant we received from the Dollar General Literacy Foundation, we will be partnering with the elementary school to offer programs to their summer classes. Also, children enrolled in the summer recreation program and summer school will receive free books to build up their home libraries. This is a wonderful opportunity and we are fortunate to have been chosen for this national and competitive grant.

As some of you may have noticed, I have begun reorganizing the children's books into "neighborhoods". So far we have the neighborhoods of Transportation and Learning



completed. The rest of the neighborhoods will be Growing up, Science, and

Stories. It's interesting to note that the Transportation books have been circulating a lot now that kids know exactly where to find their favorites.
