Eight classes from the elementary school came for **end of the year class visits**. This is an opportunity for me to give them a tour of the library, encourage them to participate in summer activities at the library and tell stories. We read books about “building” to go along with the “Build a Better World” theme this year. The kids helped me tell the story of the Three Little Pigs using puppets, and we read a book from the wolf’s perspective as well. Our end activity was to build with Strawbeez—a connecting toy that

allows kids to build large structures out of drinking straws.

**Go-Go Garden** started up again in June. This group of elementary-aged students feels a real sense of ownership over the community garden. Most of the kids are on their third year with the garden, and are very eager to make sure the garden is a success again this year. We are growing beets, tomatoes, peas, squash, garlic, and pumpkins.



We held our final-for-now **Tween**

**book club**, Chat and Chew, on June 22. The club has been small, but faithfully attended by a couple of tweens all school year. It’s been fun to read and discuss books with these two guys, as well as craft and snack. We’ll try again in the fall!

Our **summer reading program** this year will be slightly different from last year: we will still be counting minute however we have migrated to an online tracking system. We are using Wandoo Reader, an online summer reading program provided free through New York State. Parents and children register and report their minutes online. For those who do not wish to use the online option, they can still report their minutes in person and I will enter their



minutes for them. This program greatly simplifies the amount of busy work summer

reading demands of us. Even the weekly raffle drawings can be done through the program—no need for us to print and cut apart tickets. The grand prizes this year are provided by the Friends of the Library, Inc: a Kindle Fire with \$50 Amazon giftcard for teens, a mini iPad for kids, and a Leapfrog pad for kids ages 0-4.
