September is our month to prepare for the cycle of programs to kick off again in October.

We held four **storytimes** this month. These were all outreach storytimes for classes from the Elementary school: Headstart, BOCES (autistic children), and UPK (am & pm). We read stories and sang songs about frogs, as well as autumn's arrival. These classes will continue to attend storytime monthly throughout the school year.

I finished reorganizing the children's **picture book collection**. Instead of being shelved in alphabetical order by authors' last name, the books are now grouped into five major categories: Education, Growing up, Transportation, Science,

and Stories. Within in these categories, there are sub-categories. For example, Transportation is divided into Boats, Cars & Trucks, Construction Machines & Emergency Vehicles, Airplanes & Helicopters, and Trains.



Each category has a color assigned to it which makes it easier for the library staff to find where to shelf books, as well as for children to find their favorite subjects.

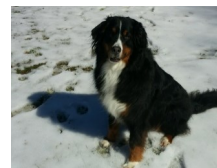
This project has been in the works for several months. We have received a lot of positive feedback on this new organizational method. Both parents and kids like the fact that they can easily find the subjects they are looking for.

for the program and the dog's owner reports the first meeting went well.

On Saturday, Sept. 23 we showed the movie "**Captain Underpants**". It was lots of fun! I served poop emoji cookies (chocolate meringue) and the kids loved it.
