For almost 150 years, the Cuba Circulating Library has served as a welcoming place for all who seek knowledge, information, and personal growth. In today's often turbulent times, it is more important than ever to reaffirm our commitment to helping all those who seek our services.

In 2018, the library was visited almost 32,000 times. We have 4,516 registered library users. We held a total of 467 programs throughout the year, including programs for toddlers, school-aged children, tweens, teens, and adults. In addition, the library regularly partners with outside organizations in an effort to support the social, economic, and educational needs of the community. Some of the organizations we partnered with include Head Start, CRCS, the Cuba Cultural Center, the Summer Recreation Program, the Palmer Opera House, and the Chamber of Commerce.

SOMETHING FOR EVERYONE

Every year, the library seeks to provide excellent programming in a variety of topics. This year was no different. We had programs on cheese making, the history of women's suffrage, alcohol inks, and mandala painting. We also held a series of mindfulness classes, including storytime yoga, a sound bath, and a mindful families event. We partnered with a variety of artists and experts to bring free, educational, and entertaining programming into the community.





Humpty Dumpty and Lapsit Storytimes have been a staple in the Cuba community for generations. In 2018, the Cuba Library also added Baby Storytime for the youngest of children to get a head start on their literacy development.

SUMMER READING

This year our Summer Reading theme was "Libraries Rock"! We had 122 children sign up for summer reading, as well as 10 teens and 20 adults. We held 66 childrens' storytimes and programs this summer to support and strengthen literacy during the summer months. In total, 1,269 children attended Cuba Library programs throughout the summer!



Through a partnership with the Summer Rec program, the library brought Benjamin Barry to teach hula hooping at the park. This program was funded by a grant from the Tri-County Arts Council.
