Summer Reading was a great success this year! Overall, we had 147 children, 8 teens, and 57 adults participate. The children and teens read 48,126


minutes, and the adults read 269 books!

The Space Cadets finished their summer program with a Space Bingo game and more space-themed books. The preschool group had a special music story time with Ashley Ward. For the last week of summer reading, we made "I Spy Busy Bags" with space themed items to search for in some goo made of dish soap, conditioner, glitter, and food coloring. None of them broke before leaving the library.

The Rocket Scientists group spent the last two weeks of summer reading working with our Sphero robots. The first week was playing

around with them and getting to know the way they work. The second week was a challenge to build and navigate through the maze using two different

mechanisms built into the robot's software. The first is a "driving" navigation where the students can just drag and drive the



robot around using the touch screens on the Kindles. The second method requires them to draw a path for the robot, set the speed at which it will drive, and start the program. The robot will follow the drawing exactly as it is on the screen. This was the more challenging of the two ways to go through the mazes but both groups were successful... eventually.

Summer school ended at the end of July but I have already scheduled some fall sessions with ACCORD and will be sending letters to the elementary school teachers.
